Other recycling & disposal options.

BATTERIES

Alkaline, lithium ion and nickel metal hydride batteries can be brought to the municipal office to be recycled.



Old car batteries can be brought to the designated area at the Public Works Yard.

CARS

Have an old car that just needs to go? Can't manage to sell it on Kijiji.ca? Give Paul Valiquette a call at 705-849-5226.

CLOTHING

Charities are always looking for gently used clothing. Try St. Vincent De Paul, the Salvation Army or SADD in Elliot Lake. If you can't make it that far, try asking around town.

ELECTRONICS

Used electronics (TVs, computers, cell phones, etc.) can be brought to the walk-in eWaste bin in the Public Works Yard. A list of accepted items can be found on the Town website. E-Waste will no longer be accepted at the landfill.



PAINT

Rona in Massey accepts used paint. Also, depending upon current projects, the municipality may have use for used paint. Call 705-844-2300 to ask, or maybe one of your friends or neighbours could use it?

METALS

The landfill (when it's open) will accept any clean scrap metal.

OIL

Have some used oil? Visit or call Walford Truck & Tractor at 705-844-2881.



HOUSEHOLD APPLIANCES

If you can't give away that old stove or fridge, bring it down to the landfill (when it's open) and we'll take care of it! But first, freon must be removed from fridges and freezers. Call Appliance Busters to help with that, 705-461-1793.



REFRIGERATOR ROUND-UP

Have an old fridge you want to get rid of? You might be eligible to save money on your new fridge and have your old one picked up! Visit saveonenergy.ca or call 1-877-797-9473 for more information!

TIRES

Drop your tires off at the landfill when it's open and we'll recycle them for you!

YARD WASTE

Call the Municipal Office to schedule an appointment to drop off your yard waste or if the landfill is open, you can bring it there as well!

What goes in my blue box?

FIBER

Newspaper/Magazines/Catalogues/Phone Books

- Includes glossy flyers
- Writing & mailing papers
- Photocopy paper & envelopes
- Please keep newspaper separate from cardboard
- Please put shredded paper in clear bags



Corrugated Cardboard

- Layered cardboard boxes
- Please fold cardboard

Boxboard

- Cereal, detergent, shoe boxes
- Boxboard and cardboard can be placed together



COMMINGLES

Glass Bottles & Jars

- Clear/coloured food & beverage containers
- Please remove lids and place in garbage
- Please keep separate from cans and plastic

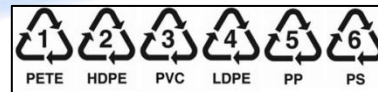
Metal Food & Beverage Containers

- Steel & aluminum food & beverage cans
- Aluminum foil trays
- Jar lids can be placed with metal food products
- Tetra Paks and cartons
- Please rinse containers



Plastic Bottles & Jars

- Containers marked with any of the following numbers:



- Please no styrofoam peanuts or packing styrofoam

NO BLUE BOX? NO PROBLEM!

Recycling can also be placed in clear bags but please, due to safety concerns, no glass.
Fiber can be placed in a large cardboard box, but the large box may not be picked up.

Landfill Hours:

May – October:

Fridays 8:00AM to 2:30PM / The third Saturday of each month from 9:00AM to 1:00PM

Tipping fees may apply.

Amnesty Days (no tipping fees, excluding demolition): 3rd Saturdays of September and October
