60-80 white or red pine trees on the north, east and west sides of Crab Lake to mill into timbers, subject to the following:

- That the timbers are to be graded as per the Ontario Building Code for it's use;
- That a building permit(s) will be required prior to any reconstruction/repairs or new buildings being erected;
- That if Crab Lake supports warm water aquatic species that a minimum shoreline buffer width of 15 metres for water quality protection be implemented and if Crab Lake supports cold water aquatic species that a minimum shoreline buffer width of 30 metres be implemented;
- That MNRF consider a replanting plan.

And further that a copy of the municipal Tree Canopy and Natural Vegetation Policy be provided to Mr. Cavanagh.
