


The library will be closed the week of Dec. 26 and will reopen Tuesday, January 3, 2023.

Consider using LED lights and hang your outdoor-rated lights with half free clips. Cut your loss and toss damaged strings—an electrical fire is a sure bet for a lousy holiday.

Keep decorations away from candles. Fires caused by holiday decorations and open flames from candles are all too common this season. Battery-operated candles are a great alternative, but if you must light up, put candles in sturdy containers and always blow out when you leave the room. 
